Whether you travel by air, by road or by sea, Brenda Cahill and other staff at the Penfield Road AAA Western and Central New York office assist thousands of the automobile association's members each year with planning dream vacations, honeymoons, family trips and quick getaways.

Cahill said many people associate AAA with roadside emergency service, which it does a lot of, but travel is the focus at the club's office in Penfield, which has been open for about 15 years. The organization serves over 800,000 members from Buffalo to Watertown with 15 offices. Penfield is one of the three AAA offices in Rochester.

"On busy days, we can have several hundred people come through the building," said Cahill.

From the 5,000-plus-square-foot office, a staff of 22 helps with everything from picking a destination, plotting driving routes, booking a flight, rental car and hotel room to renting out Global Positioning Systems and even offering driver-safety courses to save people money on their car insurance. Those courses also help reduce points on driver's licenses.



Cahill said they also sell travelers checks at the Penfield AAA office as well as a travel money card, which can be used in Europe and other countries to make purchases in local currency.

Busy seasons are "any time people have vacations, winter breaks, school breaks and long weekends," said Cahill.

For those traveling by car, she said, there is a Fuel Finder available at www.nyaaa.com.

"It will tell you the recent gasoline prices at different locations within your ZIP code," she said. "It's updated every 24 hours, of course, now days gas prices can change throughout the day, so it's difficult to keep up."

Cahill said AAA was still expecting a lot of people to travel by automobile on Memorial Day weekend despite the price of gasoline. "They may be cutting back on expenses elsewhere, because they know gasoline is more expensive," she said.

Cahill said employees at AAA are encouraged to take trips, especially to the destinations they are selling. "It helps to see the destination first-hand," she said.

Her best vacation is a toss-up between St. Petersburg, Russia and Hawaii. "I love Hawaii," she said. "Anything with palm trees."
